Introduction

Concept Web

- 1. Tejaswini used to do shooting as an NCC cadet in Kolhapur. She wanted to turn professional but she didn't have an opportunity and equipment.
- 2. In 1999, a coach, Jaisingh Kusale, noticed ability in Tejaswini and loaned her an air riffle. After that the coach passed away and the rifle was sent away with his other belongings to NCC.

3. Tejaswini had 18-month break in shooting and she had no opportunity.

- 4. Tejaswini realized the importance of getting familiar with a rifle. She had no rifle even for practice. Later Sheela Kanungo offered her an air rifle.
- 5. Tejaswini stayed focused on her career and all support of people was with her. In January 2005, Suzack Laszlo a Hungarian coach gave her training. Sunny Thomas and Raju Bhatia offered support and encouragement. Finally she won bronze at the 2009 World Cup in Munich.

Let's Practice

English language has certain rules regarding spelling the words. Here some rules are introduced. If we learn these simple rules it is easier to remember and learn words. This is how we can improve our vocabulary. English has a, e, i, o and u as vowels. Rest of the alphabets are consonants.

Doubling the Consonant

Vowel – स्वर

Words of one syllable ending in single vowel + single consonant double the consonant before a suffix beginning with a vowel, as

beg – beggar run – running rob – robbed sad – saddest

but

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wish – wishing (two consonants)
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fear - fearing (two vowels)
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like - liked (ending in a vowel)

Exception to the rule –

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bus - buses gas - gases
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wool - woolen

2) Words of more than one syllable ending in single vowel + consonant double the final consonant if the last syllable is stressed; as

begin - beginning

permit - permitted

control - controlled

but

answer - answered

conquer - conquering

Exception – kidnapped, handicapped, dialed

3) The consonant l is usually doubled, even when the stress does not fall on the last syllable as:

travel - traveller
quarrel - quarrelled
signal - signalling
distil - distiller

Exception – parallel – paralleled

4) Final 'e'

Words in silent 'e' drop the 'e' before a suffix beginning with a vowels as,

liv<u>e</u> - living

hope - hoping

mov<u>e</u> - movable

5) The 'e' remains before a suffix beginning with a consonant as:

hope - hopeful

engage - engagement

Exceptions:

true - truly

due - duly

whole - wholly

nine - ninth

Remember – when you end your letter

yours truely x yours truly √

6) Words in 'ce' or 'ge' retain the 'e' before a suffix beginning with a, o, u, so as to avoid changes in pronunciation (As a rule, 'c' and 'g' are pronounced soft before e and I but hard before a, o and u).

replace -

- replaceable

change

- chang<u>e</u>able

courage

- courageous

7) A final 'y' following a Consonant changes to 'i' before any suffix except 'ing' as:

happ<u>y</u> happ<u>i</u>ly beautiful beauty carried carry marriage marry -but – marrying marry carrying carry 'y' following a vowel does not change; as prayed

played

pray

play

Exceptions – beauteous, piteous, bounteous, plenteous, shyly, dryness, shyly.

8) The suffix 'full'

When the suffix 'full' is added to words in 'll' the second 'l' is dropped; as

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joy + full = joyfu<u>l</u>
beauty + full = beautifu<u>l</u>
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9) 'ie' and 'ei'

When 'ie' or 'ei' is pronounced (i : = $\frac{1}{5}$) as in bee the 'i' comes

before the 'e' except for c as:

believe, relieve, grieve

-but-

deceive, conceive, receipt

Exceptions – seize, counterfeit, weird

Letter Writing

A Thank you Letter – A Social Letter

Many times we like to thank or express our gratitude to the persons who have given us gifts or done us some favour or extended some kindness.

It is important to express it in a polite 'thank you' letter. It is an informal letter. Usually we need to consider the following points when writing such a letter.

- Who is the letter writer or sender of the letter.
- To whom is the letter to be addressed
- What will you thank him for
- What other details will you include in the letter

Format of an Informal Letter

- 1. Sender 's name
- 2. Sender 's address
- 3. Date
- 4. Salutation (Dear Anil,/ Dear father,)
 - **5.** The first paragraph may be an introduction where you enquire the recipient's whereabouts.
 - **6**. The second paragraph may contain the actual message and conclusion. The message to be conveyed should be clearly written. The conclusion should include conveying regards.
- 7. Sign off Finally it is signing off the letter. It is always ended with the name of the sender. It is usually ended with your loving friend / your loving son/ daughter etc.
- **8.** The sender 's name and signature.
